Organisation

Organisation du groupe classe : les élèves sont éparpillés sur un terrain délimité, un élève est le « chat ».

Durée du jeu : 5 à 10 minutes

Matériel

Avoir matérialisé les deux lignes des deux équipes à l'aide de plots, de craie ou de cordes.

Rules of the game

1. Choose one player to be in (with an "ip dip")
2. The player who is in must run around and tag as many other players as he can.
3. When tagged, a player becomes "stuck in the mud", he cannot move and must stand with his legs and arms apart. He must say "Suck in the mud".
4. The only way to be freed is for a non-tagged player to crawl through his legs. Players are safe while crawling under legs and cannot be tagged.
5. The game ends when all players have been tagged and are "stuck in the mud".

How to go further

How could you get the pupils to talk more?

For example the player who touches another player could give him an order like: "Close your eyes!" or "Touch your nose!" or ask him a question like "How old are you? Or "Where do you live?" or "What is your favourite animal?"...

Ip dip

Ip dip is a rhythmic counting-out game with many variations, the purpose of which is to select an individual from a group, for instance to choose the starting player of a game.

A Welsh version of the rhyme runs:

Ip dip dip
My blue ship
Sailing on the water
Like a cup and saucer
But you are not in *it*.

Another version, from Northern Ireland, runs:

Ip dip sky blue,
Granny sitting on the loo,
Doing farts, playing darts,
Out goes you!
O-U-T spells Out!

Another version runs:

Out goes the rat!
Out goes the cat!
Out goes the lady
With the big green hat!
Y.O.U. spells you,
O.U.T. spells out!
